Preschool Children- FREE ENTRY

- **Entry Fees must be paid as you enter.**
- **It would be appreciated by all of the Marshall' and Stewards' in each section, that your entry form be filled in prior to presenting at the entry desk of your section.**
- **ONE ENTRY FORM PER EACH PERSON IN EACH SECTION** - these can be photocopied for an extra copy for family members. There will be extra forms at the steward's desk. This serves as a record of each entry received.
- There will be extra entry forms at the Section Marshall's desk.

RULES:

1. All entries are taken from 2.30 pm - 6.00 pm on Friday 5th February in the Hokonui Pavilion, Bury St Gore. All entries must be staged by 5.55 pm, as no late entries will be accepted. **Please have your entry form filled out. Entry forms may be photocopied.**
2. Judging of all entries entered on Friday 5th February will be done behind closed doors from 7 pm. sharp.
3. PLEASE NOTE All exhibits are entered at exhibitor's own risk.
4. Exhibitors may put more than one entry in a class for any other section in -HOME CRAFTS, ART, FLOWER & VEGETABLE, PHOTOGRAPHY, and the PET CORNER.
- 5.. All entries are per class exhibited
6. All persons - (except Marshall's, Stewards, and Judges) must leave the judging area before 6 pm.
7. The Marshall of any section may move an exhibit to a more appropriate class if so needed.
8. In all Sections the decision of the Judges is final.
9. PRIZES:

Prize tickets will be awarded to exhibitors in each class (if up to standard). 1st, 2nd and 3rd. (If 1st equal, there is no 2nd prize awarded - likewise if a 2nd equal, there is no 3rd prize is awarded). In some cases (depending on how many entries) – a 4th (VHC) prize may be awarded, or even a 5th (HC) may be awarded, if the judge deems a need to award - especially in the children's classes. +

* MERIT AND SPECIAL MERIT CERTIFICATES only will be awarded, (where applicable in each section) if the Judge deems a need for an award.

. Trophies, Vouchers, Sponsored Goods, Merit and Special Merit Certificates will be awarded, (where applicable) Some sections vary.

10. All Trophies are to be returned cleaned with silver polish to the Marshall in charge of the Section concerned on the Friday afternoon prior to Show Day. If you are unable to bring your trophy back, please arrange for another person to return it well before presentation time

DEFINITION OF CLASSES:

OPEN: This is for exhibitors who have won the Novice section outright OR in any class similar previously in any Gore A & P Show or any other A & P Shows. For ages - from 14 years and over. A COMBINED SECTION OF BAKING AND COOKING SKILLS

NOVICE: This is for exhibitors who have not previously entered in any class at the Gore A & P Show, (or any other A & P Shows.) For ages - from 14 years and over. A COMBINED SECTION OF BAKING AND COOKING SKILLS

GLUTEN FREE - OPEN: A NEW SECTION

This section is for anyone so long as **ALL** the ingredients used are Gluten free, for ages 14 years and over,

A COMBINED SECTION OF BAKING AND COOKING SKILLS

BLOKES - OPEN: This is for exhibitors for ages - from 14 years and over. A COMBINED SECTION OF BAKING AND COOKING SKILLS

JUNIOR CHILDREN'S- Preschool age

HOME BAKING SECTION RULES

- **PLEASE READ YOUR SCHEDULE CAREFULLY AND ENTER THE APPROPRIATE CLASS - otherwise at the Judge's discretion your entry may be disqualified and marked - NOT according to schedule.**
- **ANY TROPHY OR TROPHIES THAT HAVE BEEN WON IN ANY SECTION - IS THE PROPERTY OF THE GORE A&P ASSOCIATION - OF WHICH HAVE BEEN KINDLY DONATED. IT IS NOT PERMITTED TO MAKE REPLICAS OF ANY TROPHY**
- ALL ENTRIES MUST BE THE EXHIBITORS OWN UNAIDED WORK.
- PLEASE NOTE all entries are entered at the exhibitors' own risk.
- Exhibitor's must not avail themselves of the services of a professional baker in any way- nor had the use of their oven.
- No cake mixes to be used in any section.
- Baking could be cut or broken in half, tested AND tasted by the Judge or Judges. - this shows the texture, flavour, even distribution of ingredients and the inward and outward appearance of an entry.
- When presenting your baking, especially in BISCUITS OR SQUARES, - MAKE SURE EACH ONE IS EVEN TO MATCH THE OTHERS, also in depth.
- ALL ENTRIES TO BE DISPLAYED ON A DISPOSABLE PLATE COVERED IN CLING WRAP ONLY (Bowl covers etc. do not give a good view of the baking) side plate size unless the entry needs a larger size or board if needed. No China plates please.

- PLEASE PLACE YOUR EXHIBITOR NUMBER ON YOUR PLATE when placing your entry - NOT THE CLING WRAP as this has to come off for judging and the number can be lost.
- AS SPACE IS LIMITED, - ONLY ONE ENTRY FROM EACH BAKING BATCH PRODUCED IN EACH CLASS PER EACH INDIVIDUAL.
- There will be a JUDGE'S CHOICE of any baking or in culinary of Preserves, Jams, etc. entry.
- If any exhibitor who wins a Trophy 3 years in succession, -they may not exhibit for 2 years.
